Since 2009, “VOTE to End Childhood Hunger” has raised more than \$26,000 through raffle basket ticket sales, bake sales and the Supervisor of Elections office cookbook.

There are nine baskets in the raffle this year, including Family Fun, Taste of Brevard, Father's Day, Date Night, Pamper Me, Stay-cation, Collectors, Explore Brevard and Bonus Basket.
