



Brevard County Supervisor of Elections Office Sends Out Military and Overseas Mail Ballots

3,344 MAIL BALLOTS WERE ISSUED TO MILITARY AND OVERSEAS VOTERS FOR THE GENERAL ELECTION

BREVARD COUNTY • VIERA, FLORIDA – Brevard County Supervisor of Elections Lori Scott announced 3,344 mail ballots were issued to military and overseas voters for the General Election, which will be held on Nov. 6.

As permitted by the Military and Overseas Voters Empowerment Act, ballots are both mailed and emailed to military and overseas voters; of the 3,344 issued ballots, 1,923 were delivered to the U.S. Postal Service and 1,421 ballots were emailed.

“Casting a ballot for military and overseas voters shouldn’t be cumbersome or a burden and my office strives to make the process seamless by educating voters of the options available to them,” said Scott.

“Additionally, I am very excited to share that for the first time; mail ballot voters can now look forward to receiving their very own I Voted By Mail sticker in their mail ballot packet.”

Currently, 95,652 civilian stateside and 921 military county ballots are currently scheduled to be mailed on October 9.
